First edition, first issue of the most influential the account on the Maranhao. Illustrated with seven engravings representing the erection of a cross and the portraits of the Indians whom Claude d'Abbeville took to Paris.

A spectacular example in 18th century red morocco of the very rare first edition of Peter Martyr in French and the first travel anthology in the French language. Apart from a French translation of Cortés's second letter (Antwerp, 1522? extant in 2 incomplete copies only), Martyr's *Extraict ou Recueil des Isles nouvellement trouuees* is the earliest printed work in French exclusively on America and the first to treat the recent American discoveries.

Richly illustrated with 163 woodcuts including a portrait of the author the book shows a great variety of measuring devices, geometrical figures etc. including the astrolabe as used by Rojas Sarmiento.

It consists of a title, an illustrated sheet with the text giving the history of this procession, printed in Italian and French, and 33 superb plates forming a frieze of more than 13 meters, all hand colored and heightened with gold. Absolutely complete copy, preserved in its original case in full morocco with the arms of Pope Gregory XVI (1765-1846).

First edition of this lavish book about the buildings of the Vatican. Carlo Fontana was a pupil of Bernini. In his description of St. Peter's, commissioned by Pope Innocent XI, he defended the work of his master against criticisms about the cracks that had appeared in the dome.

First and only edition. "As Goldicutt explains in the preface, he intended this work as an aid to interior decoration, both with regards to the design and the use of colour. Chapters 18 to 22 (pp. 449-498) contain a large variety of details on exotic and hitherto little-known produce consumed by the indigenous people.
